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Rural development in Budget-2020-21 Dr. Disha Namdes More Assistant Professor, SGBM, Purna

Abstract:

Rural development sector comprises agriculture, allied activities and irrigation. The three prominent themes in Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's second Budget -Union Budget 2020-21 are aspirational India, economic development for all and a caring society that is both humane and compassionate. Under aspirational India, the Finance Minister focused on rural development; wellness, water, sanitation and education and skills.

The Minister has allocated Rs. 2.83 lakh crore ropees for agriculture and rural developments sector. The government aims to liberalize farm markets, remove distortion in livestock and increase agriculture investment. It is also focus to increase purchase of farm produce and related services. Introduction:

The Ministry of Rural Development of India is responsible for development and welfare activities in rural areas. The Ministry has two departments: (i) rural development, and (ii) land resources.

The Department of Rural Development under the Ministry is responsible for implementation of many major schemes in rural areas. These schemes are targeted at poverty reduction, provision of basic services, employment generation, rural infrastructure and habitation development.

The Department of Land Resources aims to increase productivity of degraded land through the process of integrated watershed management. It also aims to develop an integrated land information management system to improve real-time information on land, and to optimize use of land resources.

Methodology:

Rural development Allocation on Union Budget 2020-21

As per the Union Budget document tabled by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in Parliament, Rs 61,500 crore has been allocated for the Minhatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) for the year 2020-21, down by more than 13 per cent from the total estimated expenditure for 2019-20 which was at Rs 71,001.81 crore.

Sources in the Rural Development Ministry said the actual expenditure incurred in 2020-21 will be higher than the allocated funds and it will at least be at par with this year's total estimated expenditure of MGNREGS.

Senior officials in the ministry said the total expenditure under MGNREGS during 2008 to 2014, under the Congress-led UPA government, was Rs 1.9! lakh crore which jumped to Rs 2.95 lakh crore during 2014 to 2020, during the tenure of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi- led agriculture.

However, the funds allotted under other premier flagship schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) and the Pradhan Mantri Awans Yojana (PMAY), welfare schemes for roads and housing respectively in rural areas, have increased.



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Talking about the government's welfare schemes for rural areas, Sitharaman said," Under the Deen Dayal Antyodaya Yojana for alleviation of poverty, 58 lakh Self Help Groups (SHGs) have been mobilized. We shall further expand on SHGs."

Unlike the Department of Rural Development, the allocation for the Department of Panchayati Raj has almost doubled to Rs 900.94 erore for the year 2020-21 from Rs 500 erore from the estimated expenditure incurred in 2019-20. Both departments come under the same ministry.

The allocation for the Department of Panchayan Raj has increased on account of higher funds allotted to the Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abbiyan from an estimated expenditure of Rs 465.46 crore in 2019-20 to Rs 857.53 crore in 2020-21 Speaking on the importance of panchayans in her Budget speech,

Sitharaman said the government's vision is that all "public institutions" at gram panchayat level such as angain adds, health and wellness centers, government schools, PDS outlets, post offices and police stations will be provided with digital connectivity.

So. Fiber to the Home (FTTH) connections through Bharasnet will link one lakh gram panchayats this year. It is proposed to provide Rs 6,000 crore to the Bharasnet programme in 2020-21, she said.

In 2020-21, the Department of Rural Development has an allocation of Rs 1,20,147 erore, On the other hand, the Department of Land Resources has an allocation of Rs 2,251 erore.

 Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS), continues to account for more than half of the Department's budget. However, the funds allocated to it have decreased by 13% this year.

Funds allocated for the rural roads schedie. Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) has been an increase of 39% from the proof estimates of 2019-20.

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Conclusions:

Allocations in the Union Budget for various the ship schemes under the Department of Rural Development was marginally reduced to Rs 1.20 fakli cross for the year 2020-21 from Rs 1.22 fakli cross in 2019-20, while the funds allotted for employment guarantee scheme MGNREGA came down by Rs 9.500 erore during the same period.
